

Purpose

The IDP Outstanding Firm Award recognizes firms for exemplary commitment and contributions to the professional development of interns.

Criteria

Firms will be judged for the success of their programs in support of interns, including training opportunities, mentoring, continuing education programs, and commitment to the Intern Development Program.

Nominations

State and local IDP and education coordinators, students, interns participating in IDP, licensed architects, and AIA components may make nominations.

Firms that have previously received this award must demonstrate ongoing, continuous improvement to their intern programs.

Categories

- Small Firm—7 or fewer employees
- Medium Firm—8 to 49 employees
- Large Firm—50 or more employees

One finalist will be selected from each category. An overall winner will be selected from the three finalists.

Submission Materials

The submission package must include all of the following:

Completed Firm Identification form
 The four Firm Statements described on the Firm
 Identification form should be sent in hard copy and as an electronic file on a disk.

- Completed Nominator's Statement of Support form
- Three letters of recommendation, one of which must be from an active IDP intern

Support materials (e.g., program announcements, innovative ways of recording IDP activities) are optional. All submission materials must arrive together in the same package.

Deadline

Submission packages must be postmarked on or before February 28, 2003.

Award

Winning firms will receive an IDP Outstanding Firm certificate and will be profiled in the AIA's *AIArchitect* and NCARB's *Direct Connection*. The certificate will be presented at the AIA 2003 National Convention and Expo in San Diego.
